EDUCATION PROGRAM INFORMATION GUIDE 2018—2019

Program Overview

Waradah caters to the education market with a series of programs aimed at both domestic and international students. These programs have been developed to broaden students understanding of indigenous culture by engaging them through a series of activities and informative talks. The programs are offered in a morning or afternoon session with durations of 60 or 90 minutes and groups have the option to view either the Live Performance (Australian Content Based) or the Short Film (Aboriginal Content based).

The main components of the programs are run within the centres Education Room and can accommodate groups of up to 40 participants at once. For larger bookings, we utilise the overflow space. If your group is larger than this, contact us to discuss the possibility of splitting the group across different times.

Please note that Program start times are dependent on theatre option selected. The theatre portion of the program is always the last item on the itinerary to allow for boomerang drying.

Cancellation Policy

A 50% cancellation fee applies to group bookings between 10—79 pax cancelled within 48 hours from 9am of day of event

A 100% cancellation fee applies to group bookings of 80+ pax cancelled within 48 hours from 9am of day of event

Day of event cancellations or “no show” bookings will incur full fee payable

Pax numbers are defined by those in package activities engaged as a participant and therefore eligible for charge



Current Programs

Dingo—60 Minute Program

The dingo program is centred around Aboriginal Art and its use within Indigenous culture, with students given a briefing on individual symbols, whilst they paint their own stories on the supplied boomerangs. This is a great way for students to develop an understanding of storytelling methods used by indigenous nations to teach their young various aspects of everyday life. After the boomerang portion of the program is complete, students are then ushered into the Waradah Theatre for either the Live Performance—Waradah: An Australian Story or the Short Film—Banggarrai. The theatre will be shared with the general public but your group will be given priority seating to ensure the best possible views.

We encourage groups to arrive at least 10 minutes prior to any program to ensure prompt start times, this ensures the maximum value can be delivered to your group.

Current Programs

Kangaroo—90 Minute Program (Domestic/International Students)

The Kangaroo Program is the most popular program at Waradah and includes all the features of the Dingo program but with an added exclusive Aboriginal Cultural talk. The program is not only available for Schools and domestic groups but is our offering for **International Students**.

Students are encouraged to ask questions during the session and the subject matter can be customised to address any specific group needs. **Please contact Waradah prior to your event to discuss any specific cultural talk topics you require.**

Students are then given a briefing on individual Aboriginal art symbols, whilst they paint their own stories on the supplied boomerangs.

After the Cultural talk and Boomerang portion of the program is complete, students are then ushered into the Waradah Theatre for either the Live Performance—Waradah: An Australian Story or the Short Film—Banggarrai. The theatre will be shared with the general public but your group will be given priority seating to ensure the best possible views.
